## About Today’s Worship

**Passing the peace** is a tradition rooted in Scripture that embodies our identity as peacemakers (Matt. 5:9; 2 Cor. 5:20) and trains our hearts, hands, and tongues in the ways of peace. From the beginning Christians have exercised this practice. “Peace be with you” is a greeting Jesus himself used with his disciples (Luke 24:36; John 20:19, 26). The apostle Paul opened each of his letters with the words “Grace and peace be with you” (Rom. 1:7; 1 Cor. 1:3; 2 Cor. 1:2).

## More About Today's Worship

Christian Education (CE) Sunday is an occasion in which we celebrate the many and valuable contributions made by those who commit time, talents, energy, resources, and more to the continuing educational work of the church. Jesus, the great teacher and rabbi, taught that the greatest lesson to be learned in life is to love, love God, love neighbors, love as God loves. This type of love is known as **agape**, a selfless, sacrificial, unconditional love that lies at the heart of our relationship with God.

In today's Gospel text, Jesus reinstates Peter by twice asking whether Peter **agapes** him. Both times, Peter replies, "Yes, Lord, you know that I *phileo* you." Peter says he loves Jesus in familial, brotherly kind of way, but not unconditionally. The third time, Jesus meets Peter at his level asking, "Peter, do you *phileo* me?" to which Peter replies, "You know all things; you know that I *phileo* you." Jesus gives Peter a job promotion, commissioning the once fisherman a shepherd who will sacrificially tend God's flock.

The haunting words at the close of the Gospel text remind us of the quote at the top of today's worship. "What we can do for others is the test of powers; what we can suffer is the test of love." Although Peter confessed only a familial love for Jesus, he would later show through his actions unconditional love for his Lord. Brook Foss Westcott, who authored the quotation, also said, "Great occasions do not make heroes or cowards; they simply unveil them to the eyes of [all]. Silently and imperceptibly, as we wake or sleep, we grow strong or weak; and at last some crisis shows us what we have become." Today is truly a great occasion, one when, above all else, we celebrate the many gifts of life-giving love.
